# **BUILDING UPDATE**

Things are really starting to move along and with scaffolding starting to come down the real shape and look of the building is more obvious.

#### **IMPETIGO (SCHOOL SORES)**

We have had a few children become infected with Impetigo (you say, im-pa-ty-go), also known as school sores, causes blisters on exposed parts of body, such as hands, legs and face. The blisters burst and turn into a sore with a yellow crust that gets bigger each day. This is highly contagious and needs to be treated.

**Time off school -** Until sores have dried up or 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has started.


## ICAS Tests – years 3 to 6 students

The subjects assessed in ICAS are Digital Technologies, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing. Each year, a team of subject experts develop the tests. Experts write skills-based assessments designed to assess the level of competency a student possesses in each subject area.
