### JUNIOR TOUGH GUY & TOUGH GAL CHALLENGE 2023

On Friday the 25th of August, a group of 8 students from Ōhope Beach School went to Rotorua to compete in the Junior Tough Guy and Tough Gal Challenge. This is a fun mud run with some obstacles to add to the excitement. The Year 3 & 4's (George, Lachie & Mathew) ran 1.5 km while the Year 5 & 6 students (Kyran, Selena, Brianna, SJ and Charlee) had to run 3 km!

At one part George was going from the water, up the hill and he slipped, face planting into the ground, but he got straight back up and kept running until he got through the endless mud at the finish line. He says, "It was so fun, and I can't wait to do it again next year!"

Brianna and Selena say, "Our favourite part was running through all the mud and going over lots of obstacles like hurdles, the big cargo net, and the net wall. We were stuck up that for about 2 min! The hardest part was going up the big hill because it was so steep and slippery, so we had to use a rope to help us."

At the end of the run, they all got to have a quick cold shower and then jump into a hot pool to warm up. They all received a medal for completing the challenge too.

The girl suggested, "If you don't mind getting muddy, and being a bit stinky, we really think you should have a go!"

#### Aquabots

On Tuesday 29 August we worked with Jessica, in groups, and had the chance to build an underwater robot, an aquabot. The aquabot had to be able to pick up an object, bring it to us and then put it back.

We have a controller which makes the robot go up and down and forwards and backwards which we had to attach the batteries and wires to. We needed to measure lengths of plastic tubes, put them in a vice, and cut them with a saw. We used a drill to put holes in the elbows before joining them together.

We had to waterproof the monitors with tape and toilet wax so water would not get into the motor. "The toilet wax was extremely sticky and stuck my fingers together," said Sienna.

We also used a soldering iron to attach the wires and to protect the monitors.

We had to follow the instructions to create our aquabot and Jessica helped us when we needed it. We still have some work to do to complete our project and we need to carry out a test drive in water.

We learnt a lot about using equipment safely.

The winning art works have been used to create the tickets for the show. We look forward to sharing the creativity of the children and the staff at the performances during week 10.


