Ngā Huiarau Artwork:

"The art works we created are related to ocean creatures. First, we drew our draft on scrap paper, we did use a chrome book to find an ocean creature shape to draw. We then drew our shape on card with a sharpie.

After that we used PVA glue to go over the sharpie lines. While it was still wet, we placed wool on the sharpie lines and left them to dry.

Once it had dried, we loosely scrunched up a sheet of tinfoil, then we opened it up and placed it onto our art shape. We smoothed out the tin foil, making sure not to rip it.

Lastly, we used coloured sharpies and filled in the flat spaces but left the raised pieces uncoloured.


