The senior student presenters continue to impress with their pronunciation, the clarity of their speaking and the collaboration they model each morning.

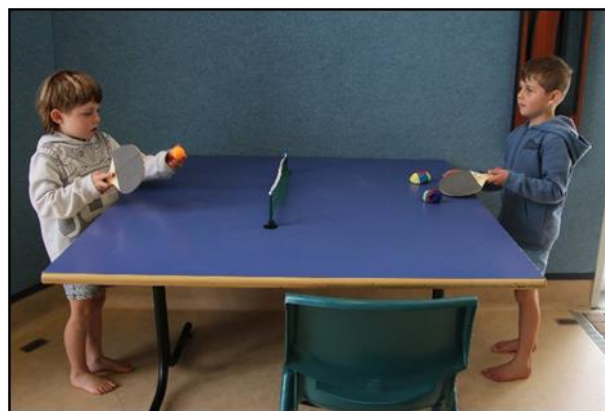


### **PRIDE Time:**

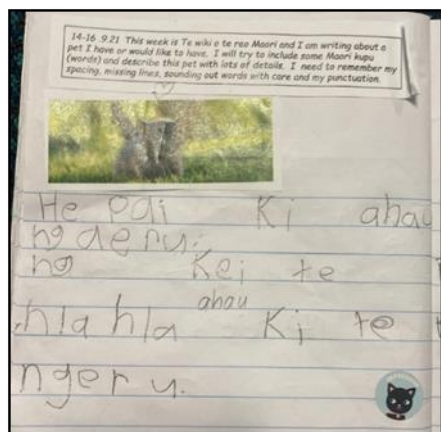
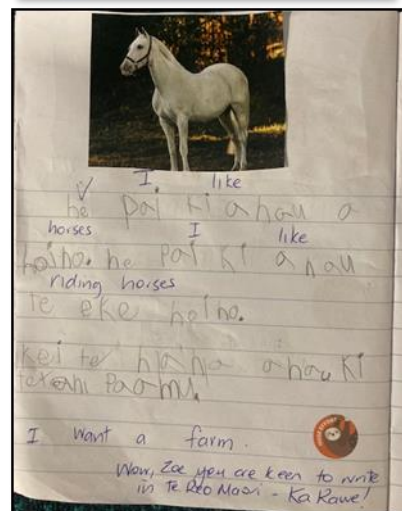
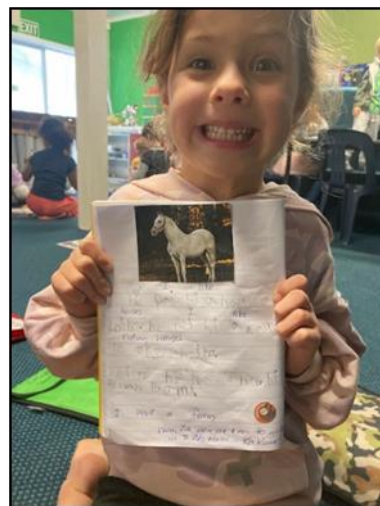
If you still have chrome books, chargers or reading books at home from lockdown please send them back with your child or drop them into the office. Thank you so much.
