This whakataukī means I am like a fledgling, a newborn bird just learning to fly. This reminds us that we are always learning new things and gaining new knowledge to help us fly.



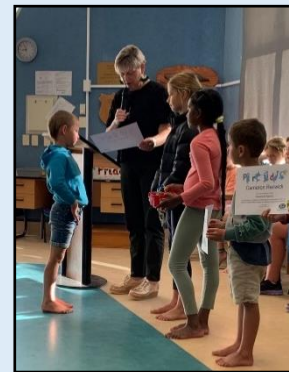

LSC Corner - Learning at Home

There are lots of ways you can support your child's learning at home. This week the focus is on maths.

Maths

- Bake with your child, read the recipe, talk about the measuring language
- Look at letterboxes, reading numbers, counting backwards or forwards from that number, or what number comes before or after that number
- Discuss shapes around you, what shapes can be seen in nature
- Do some water play with different containers and measurements
- Make up a treasure hunt
- Go shopping and ask for specific items (e.g.) get 400 grams of mince, 6 apples etc.
- Have a clock – practice reading times, both digital and analogue
- Make paper darts/jets – which flies the longest or highest, how can these be improved?
- Practice basic number facts
- Learn family of facts $4+6=10$ $6+4=10$ $10-6=4$ $10-4=6$
- Play card games
- Practice writing numbers in the sand when walking on the beach

Make these fun activities which encourage your child to engage in maths.
