### The Principal Column

#### FROM THE DESK OF CATHRYN NAERA:

Kia ora koutou katoa

Thank you for your support of the union meeting for teachers yesterday afternoon. Negotiations have been ongoing for quite some time now and the teachers have a new offer, from the Government, to consider. Voting on this current offer will be from Wednesday 31st May to Tuesday 6th June. The outcome of the vote will be known on Wednesday 7th June. If the offer is accepted industrial action will end, however if the offer is rejected we may see further industrial action.

Last Thursday we held our school cross country in excellent weather conditions. The course offers a range of conditions which include the stream crossing, mud navigation, hill climbs and flat grassland. The children all competed with pride and gave their best in both the individual events and the team events. Thank you to Whaea Sandy and Matua Sam for their organisation of the event and the preparation of the course. Thank you to Ngati Awa who allow us to use the farmland for our cross country event.

The first eight children in the 8yrs, 9yrs, 10yrs and 11yrs qualified for the inter school cross country. This event is planned to be held at Ōhope Beach School on Thursday 1st June (today). Good luck to all our competitors. The next event will be the EBOP cross country event which is planned for Thursday 8th June.

#### The Refreshed New Zealand Curriculum - Te Mātaiaho:

The Ministry of Education has been working on the refresh of the NZ Curriculum and its supporting documents for some time. The document contains eight learning areas each being developed and due for release between now and 2025. The eight learning areas are: English, Social Sciences, Technology, The Arts, Mathematics and Statistics, Science, Health and Physical Education and Learning Languages. We have begun to unpack the English and Mathematics and Statistics documents so we can plan for any changes that are included in these documents.

Maths: We have been working with Charlotte Wilkinson, a maths facilitator, to ensure we are covering all of the maths curriculum. We use an assessment screen at the start of the year to ascertain aspects of maths that the children are confident in and what areas are incorporated into planning and teaching for the year. It is important to note that maths is part of daily life and children develop maths skills through a range of activities both inside and outside the

English: We are in the process of reviewing our English Curriculum Plan for the school which will incorporate our structured literacy practices and the work we have been carrying out on oral language, spelling and writing. We have been working with a facilitator from Cognition Education who has worked with the leadership team and literacy team to ensure we are incorporating all aspects into our planning and teaching.

#### DISCO:

Thank you to everyone who supported the DISCO last Thursday. We thank the team who organised the event, helped with mask making, carried out sausage cooking and were present on the night in the hall. The children really enjoyed the evening, especially after a day of cross country. Thank you to all the staff who assisted on the night, you are appreciated for your dedication to the students and families of the school. The funds raised will be going towards our musical garden plans for the playground.
