Te Tiwai Team:

The Blue bus (town bus) is still free for the children to ride to and from school. However, each child does need to have a Bee Card but there is no charge.

Whaea Sandy will send a bus contract home with those children who do use the bus service. Please return this to school as soon as possible. This also confirms your child is using the service and we are able to add them to our bus registers. This is for all three of the bus services we have.

Swimming:

Our pool is ready for swimming and your child can bring their togs and towel for their swimming sessions. **Please name togs and towels** as they often end up in the lost property. Your child's teacher will be able to tell you which days your child has swimming. Thank you to our caretakers, Pete and Val, for ensuring the pool was ready for us this term.

Pitopito Korero:

Each day we have senior students who present our Pitopito Korero (morning news) over the sound system to all classes. The presenters always introduce themselves when they start their broadcast. Other items include the karakia, our fortnightly whakatauki, our Te Reo phrase for the week and notices for students.

The children present for a week and all year 6 children will have the opportunity to present throughout the year.



This week we welcome Archie and Riley who have started

the year for us. Well done to the two of you for being the first to take up this responsibly for our first week at school.

This week the whakataukī we are sharing is: **He manu hou ahau, he pi ka rere** This whakatauki means: I am like a fledgling, a newborn bird just learning to fly. This relates to learning new skills as young learners.

Our Te Reo phrase for the week is: Kei te pēhea koe? How are you?

Lost Property:

We would like to work on having less lost property this year. You can help with this by ensuring all items are named. This includes drink bottles and lunch boxes which sometimes end up in the lost property as well. Term one is also when we end up with togs and towels in the lost property. Please name these items when they come to school.
